#### Senior Contract

#### Expectations and Understanding For Participation in Commencement Exercises

Board of Education ("BOE") Policy #4540 provides that students shall be permitted to participate in commencement exercises if they: (1) meet the requirements for a diploma or a certificate; (2) have fulfilled their financial obligations; and (3) meet other conditions, established by the Department of Education, which meet the standards of clarity, reasonableness, and justifiability.

Participation in our school's commencement is voluntary. In order to exercise the privilege of participating in commencement, students are expected to meet all of the following requirements:

 Complete all academic requirements for a diploma or a certificate by May 12th, 2023. Students must turn in and complete all work.

If a student receives an "F" for any course required for graduation credit, the student will not be permitted to participate in the commencement ceremony.

(2) Meet all financial obligations by paying all school debts by May 12<sup>th</sup>, 2023. Financial debts include but are not limited to, the cost of individually assigned textbooks or borrowed library books and material that are lost by the student, and any restitution agreements between the students and parents and the school for vandism or negligence pursuant to Chapter 8-19, Hawaii Administrative Rules. Financial obligations must be paid to the Main Office.

Textbooks need to be returned by May 12th, 2023, NO EXCEPTIONS! Return all PE Uniforms and Equipment by May 12th, 2023. Return all Athletic Uniforms and Equipment by May 12th, 2023.

- (3) During all Quarters of the student's senior year, the student must not be found to have committed one (1) Chapter 19 Class A or Class B offense.
  - a. Committing a Class A or Class B offense in Quarters 1, 2, or 3 will result in a forfeit of half your Graduation tickets
  - Committing a Class A or Class B offense in Quarter 4 will result in a forfeit of the student's ability to participate in the Graduation Ceremony.
- (4) During all Quarters of the student's senior year, the student must not have been found to have committed two (2) Chapter 19 Class C and/or Class D offenses.
  - a. Committing 2 (two) Class C and/or Class D offense in Quarters 1, 2, or 3 will result in a forfeit of half your Graduation tickets
  - Committing 2 (two) Class C and/or Class D offense in Quarter 4 will result in a forfeit of the student's ability to participate in the Graduation Ceremony.

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#### Expectations and Understanding For Participation in Commencement Exercises

- (6) Attend all practices and rehearsals for commencement exercises, which will be held on the following date(s): May 17 & 18, 2023. (Subject to change)
  - a. Only the Principal is authorized to excuse a participant from attending Graduation rehearsal.
  - b. Work is not a valid excuse to miss Graduation rehearsal.
- (7) Wear appropriate attire at the commencement. This constitutes a Cap, Gown, and Tassel approved by the school AND appropropriate clothing attire under the gown.
- (7) Preceding or during commencement, the student must not be found by school administrator(s) to have violated the law or provisions of Chapter 19.

Each Graduate may earn upto 10 (ten) graduation tickets. In order to earn the tickets the students must do the following:

- Complete PTP by October 20, 2022 5 tickets
  - o Complete PTP by December 16, 2022 3 tickets, loss of 2 tickets if submitted late
- Attend Song Practices 1 ticket per practice (Max. 5)
- No behavior infractions 2 tickets per quarter (Quarters 1, 2 & 3)
- Perfect attendance in Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 2 tickets total

All seats will be assigned following COVID-19 restrictions and policies, should they be in place at the time of the ceremony. All aspects of tickets and seating arrangements for Graduation are subject to change depending on guidelines from the Department of Education. Families will be notified if changes have been made.

Failure to submit this contract by the time stated on the signature page will result in the student forfeiting their right to participate in the Commencement Ceremony.

#### Rehearsals and Commencement Day Policies

Much planning has gone into this year's Commencement Ceremony. To ensure that all goes well, the following rules have been established and will be enforced.

- Students are not allowed to be under the influence of alcohol or any other illegal substance during rehearsals AND before, during, or after the ceremony.
- Foghorns, bubbles, whistles, balloons, inflatable objects, silly string, etc. are not allowed in the commencement ceremony.
- Students will behave in a DIGNIFIED MANNER that reflects positively on them and Kea'au High School.
- No decorations or ornaments allowed on the caps or gowns except what was earned and distributed by school personnel.
- The Commencement Committee and Advisors will not be responsible for any lost items brought to rehearsals or the ceremony.

#### On the day of Commencement - Friday, May 19, 2023:

- 1. Be at the school Gym by 2:30 pm.
  - Have your undecorated Cap, Gown, and Tassel and school approved cords/stoles.
- 2. Suggested attire for males: Dark pants, light shirt with a collar.
- 3. Suggested attire for females: Skirt, dress shorts or a skirt with a collarless top.
- 4. All graduates must wear shoes or sandals. No slippers!

#### Consequences

- 1. Deny participation of the violator in the Commencement Ceremony
- 2. Discontinue the ceremony before its completion

Failure to return the signed contract by September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022, disqualifies the student from participation. New students entering after September 30th, 2022 will have **2 days** from the receipt of the agreement to return it signed to the Main Office.

Note: A student, who wishes to participate in commencement but is denied participation because requirements agreed to on the "Expectations and Understanding for Participation in Commencement Exercises" form were not met, may appeal the denial to the Principal. Dean Cevallos at 313-3322.

#### Signal Vine




